

Re:Marks

E. Stanley Jones (1884 – 1973) was a worldwide missionary-statesman. He was a profoundly influential Methodist evangelist, whose sermons and writings deeply impacted a long list of people, including Gandhi and Martin Luther King, Jr. His name is always referenced with reverence, though I must confess that I never read much of his work until recently. I've been inspired to go back and read E. Stanley Jones – to better understand his setting and to discover what relevance he could offer today. Let me share some insight from him.

In a book chapter entitled, "The Threefold Genius of the Christian Faith," Jones named these about the Christian faith:

- 1. It creates faith in God which creates faith in people.
- 2. It re-creates people.
- 3. It reconciles and unites people.

Perhaps you can look back on your life & see all three. Let me offer three brief testimonies from mine related to my life as your pastoral leader.

The Christian faith created a capacity within my pastoral leadership to have faith in God. Instead of presuming that I need to have all the leadership answers, my faith in God prompts me to trust God. As we look ahead for our next steps, the future is oftentimes daunting to navigate. People's priorities have changed. Our culture has shifted. Technology has a way of accelerating it all. And this has a bearing on our church's context for ministry. In my leadership role, people frequently expect me to have the answer to every question, and to manage each detail according to his or her taste. My Christian faith, however, calls me to trust in God's wisdom and strength. As Jones noted, this faith also creates faith in people. You are called to lead, too! Related to my pastoral leadership, my Christian faith compels me to have confidence in people to share the joy & responsibility of leading. After all, you and others in the congregation are gifted, skilled, and passionate. I have faith in you!

The Christian faith re-creates me. During distressing times, God has been faithful to me. While others may want to quite to run away, my faith opened my eyes to God's faithfulness. This, in turn, challenged me to persevere. Through reading Scripture, prayer, and participating in church life, God let me discover the resources needed to press forward. In due time, by God's grace, I found myself thinking and speaking in ways more patient and compassionate, and with clearer perspective, too. So, I can reflect back at who I was and who I am now. Yes, the Christian faith re-creates people, including me.

The Christian faith reconciles and unites people. Remember the importance of our sins being forgiven. This can never be overly appreciated or underestimated. I've made mistakes in my leadership & received forgiveness – from God and from church members. Forgiveness has a way of bringing people onto the same plane. It also draws people, who were otherwise estranged, into closer proximity. Relationships become renewed, and fellowship is experienced in a life-giving way. The Christian faith reconciles and unites us.

It's the genius of the Christian faith at work within me and within you. Thanks be to God!

Church History

Growing up at First UMC Salisbury, it seemed like all churches were enjoying phenomenal growth. Financial prosperity replaced economic depression. The horror of World War faded. Peace prevailed. Families joined churches in unprecedented numbers. Communities struggled to build sanctuaries fast enough. New members and their baby boomer children flocked to worship almost every Sunday.

In that post war culture, many Christians didn't need to or forgot how to share their faith. It was unnecessary. Churches planned programs rather than revivals. We mistakenly assumed everyone was already Christian. That attitude eventually led to declines in church attendance, fewer members, and empty classrooms.

John Wesley faced a similar religious crisis in the 18th century. In England, the industrial revolution created a massive human migration. People moved from rural farms to city manufacturing jobs.Established churches missed the opportunity to share their faith with new arrivals. They focused instead on maintaining existing congregations. Churches looked inward instead of outward.

Miraculously change came. Wesley lit a spiritual fire that altered the face of Christianity. It was not accidental. He carefully and methodically planned it. People even called us Methodists.

In these Ecclesia history articles, I want to look at some of Wesley's evangelistic methods. They can be as effective today as they were in Wesley's England. They might even be the way forward for our congregation.

Evangelism principle number one is a renewed emphasis on personal prayer. Wesley believed in prayer. He devoted two hours every day to it. When I visited his London home where he died, I noticed a prayer desk by his bed. The wooden edge is worn smooth through daily use.

Prayer is evangelistically important for at least three reasons -

#1, prayer changes things. It changes us. Through prayer we become God's co-workers. Prayer conveys divine power. It enables us to do with God's help what we cannot do on our own. God answers prayer, but first we need to place our petitions before God. Modern Christians are not likely to adopt Wesley's practice of praying two hours every day, but faith sharing evangelism begins with prayer.

#2, prayer is like a heart transplant. It creates in us a clean heart and renews God's spirit within us (Psalm 15:10). It gives us new eyes to view the world. Too often we only see the people who look like us, think like us, and behave like us. Prayer gives us a broader vision. Through prayer we see spiritual and physical needs in all God's children.

#3, prayer gives us imagination. It helps us see what God is doing now. It gave Wesley the courage to take God's message outside the sanctuary to places people gathered. Prayer can give us the courage to see and embrace changes needed to reach Salisbury's growing diverse population.

Christianity has been in decline across 21st century America. The solution lies not in new church programs or building renovations. It is found, as Wesley discovered, in the daily practice of prayer. That is how we reignite vital faith in a spiritually hungry world. I will say more about John Wesley's evangelistic methods next month.

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





Emergency Preparedness Training

Kimberly Cruz, Public Health/Child Care Health, Consultant provided Emergency Preparedness and Response training. Brittney Lewis, Child Development Center/NC Pre-K Director, Scotty Adcock, After-School Child Care/Summer Day Camp, Crystal Derringer, Teacher/Child Development Center, Josh Starnes, Director of Music Ministry, Mike Fansler, Building Superintendent and Dr. Sarah Hensley, Board Chairman of Child Development Center completed the training and received a Certificate of Completion approved by the Division of Child Development and Early Education, North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services.

The training focused on the importance of licensed child care programs to be adequately prepared to respond to the needs of children and others in the event of disasters and emergencies. An emergency drill for natural disasters is required at least every three months. The team will review the current EPR Plan to address natural and man-made disasters to ensure the safety and protection of the children and the staff. Natural and man-made disasters include but not limited to the following: fire, tornado, flood, power failures, chemical spills, bomb threats, earthquakes, blizzards, nuclear disasters, or dangerous person(s) in the vicinity.

The next step is for the team to assign staff members EPR responsibilities based on the strengths of the staff members that are certified in Emergency Preparedness and Response Training.

FIRST: A QUICK LOOK AT OUR STRUCTURE

IT STARTS WITH YOU!

You are a committed leader within your local church faithfully participating in the life and ministries of your local congregation through your **prayers**, **presence**, **gifts**, **service**, and **witness**.

YOUR CHURCH IS PART OF A DISTRICT

The Virginia Conference has **eight districts** -- Coastal Virginia, Living Waters, Mission Rivers, Mountain View, Northern Virginia, Shenandoah River, Three Notch'd, and Valley Ridge.

YOUR DISTRICT IS PART OF AN ANNUAL CONFERENCE

Your church is one of approximately 875 churches in the **Virginia Annual Conference.** The United States has 54 annual conferences, supervised by bishops in 46 episcopal areas. There are 75 annual conferences in Africa, Europe, and the Philippines, which are supervised by 20 bishops.





YOUR CONFERENCE IS PART OF A JURISDICTION

There are five US Jurisdictions -- North Central, Northeastern, South Central, Southeastern, and Western. Virginia is part of the **Southeastern Jurisdiction** or SEJ.

WE ARE A WORLDWIDE CHURCH

Outside the US, Annual Conferences are organized into seven **Central Conferences**. Together we all make up the United Methodist Church.





WE ARE GOVERNED BY THREE BODIES

The United Methodist Church does not have a central headquarters or a single executive leader. Duties are divided among bodies that include the **Judicial Council**, the **General Conference**, and the **Council of Bishops**.

GENERAL CONFERENCE SETS POLICY

The General Conference meets every four years. Legislation is examined and voted upon by **persons elected** from Annual Conferences from **across the denomination**. The Council of Bishops presides over General Conference and the Judicial Council reviews passed legislation to determine its constitutionality, legality, or meaning.

THE ROAD TO GENERAL CONFERENCE



WHAT DO DELEGATES DO AT GENERAL CONFERENCE?



PLENARY SESSIONS

The full body of the General Conference meets together for worship, dialogue, and voting. It is in **full plenary sessions** where votes are taken on petitions and resolutions.

VOTING

Each General Conference delegate votes on legislation brought before the body. Most legislation requires only a **majority vote**.



Changes to the **constitution** require **both** a 2/3 vote by the General Conference and a 2/3 aggregate vote of lay and clergy members in annual conferences.

AFTER GENERAL CONFERENCE



REVISED DOCUMENTS

The Book of Discipline, the Book of Resolutions, and other documents as approved by the General Conference are updated with revisions. Passed legislation usually becomes effective on **January 1st** of the following year.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

Constitutional amendments passed by 2/3 of the General Conference are sent to Annual Conferences for voting. Those **elected to attend Annual Conference** from their church or district will cast a vote.

Safe Sanctuary Policy Updated

The Trustees Committee has approved an update to the Safe Sanctuary policy. Training for staff and volunteers who regularly work with children, youth, and vulnerable adults will begin this summer.

The Safe Sanctuary Policy is our document that directs how we as the church, are doing our due diligence to ensure that this is a safe place for all God's children to be welcomed and cared for. It outlines procedures for how we conduct background checks, how classrooms/programming leadership is managed, and new in this policy - how vendors are will now be asked to check in with the volunteer at the front desk. Those interested in learning more can visit the church website, under Policies & Forms. The new policy will be posted by June 1.

Our Safe Sanctuary policy was updated by a team including youth ministry volunteers, parents of young children within the church, representatives from SPRC & Trustees, in consultation with Church Council, and led by our Director of Discipleship Ministries.
