

Re:Marks

During these summer months, we would all do well to spend some time reflecting deeply upon who we are as the Church and what we are called to do. For these questions, author Reggie McNeal offers some compelling thoughts in his book, Missional Renaissance: Changing the Scorecard for the Church. McNeal especially mentions three shifts. In all three, we imagine where we've been (and perhaps stuck) and the direction we need to go. These shifts do not happen immediately for a group, no do they happen easily. I agree with McNeal, however, that these three shifts must happen in order for the Church to thrive.

Shift #1 - From an Internal to an External Ministry Focus

Our natural inclination is to protect ourselves and strive to ensure our own future. When this becomes evident, we see just how human the Church is. Think about the conversations and decisions frequently made. Their presumptions often deal with survival or our own entertainment. Success is defined in terms of activities and numerical goals. Meanwhile, our community changes, has real needs, and the widening gap between community & Church becomes nearly too vast.Recently I heard Bishop Gregory Palmer say that the Church's worst sin in recent years is this: not being connected to our community. Making this necessary shift – from an internal focus to an external focus – requires a radical change in mindset, along with a dogged determination over the long haul.

Shift #2 - From Program Development to People Development

The old assumption was the people needed to be in church activities in order to be real Christians. The more people attended programs, the better off they would be. As those numbers increased, so did the Church's ego. But is that necessarily true? People who have drifted away would yell, "no!" And actually, several studies reveal that active church members attending programs do not reflect a more holy value set than the culture at large. Instead of developing programs, let's focus on developing people. This is hard work! It's not completed in an eight-week course. Also, a person's growth is neither linear nor easily deciphered. Making this necessary shift – from developing programs to developing people – requires giving up old assumptions and taking seriously God's work of sanctification in people.

Shift #3 - From Church-Based to Kingdom-Based Leadership

Remember Jesus taught parables about the Kingdom of Heaven or the Kingdom of God, not an organization we call "Church." As such, leaders need to imagine what they do as Kingdom work. That goes for me, any clergy person, and certainly every lay person leading, too. When the Church reflects the Kingdom, reveals the Kingdom, or points to the Kingdom, we sure are thankful. Being caught up in Kingdom living, as opposed to Church growth, liberates us! It grants us an assurance that we're on the right track instead of chasing an uncatchable phantom. Making this necessary shift – from Church-based to Kingdom-based – requires less of an emphasis on institutional maintenance and more of an incarnational influence.

Think about these three shifts relative to your Christian discipleship. What does it mean for you to make these shifts?



Breeze: New Church Management Software

Breeze Online Directory

First United Methodist Church Salisbury is moving to a new online directory called Breeze ChMS. This change will streamline a number of services for church members and staff, saving us money



every month. Our new online directory will also have an app that you can download.

How do I start with new online directory?

On June 13 members will receive an email invitation from fumcsalisbury.breezechms.com. It will have a link for you to create a username and password. Then you can login. "fumcsalisbury" is the specific church code you will need to get to the login page.

What will I see when I login?

You will see a Dashboard. You can click on My Profile and check your information or edit your contact information. You will need to upload a photo to your profile in the new directory. To logout from Breeze, click on the gear icon and choose Logout. As with all online accounts, please remember to log out, and never save your password when using a public computer.

What if I don't get an email with invitation to login to Breeze?

We may need to update your email address. Please call the church office. Leave your name, phone and current email address. You will get a call or an email.

Can I still use the "old" online directory?

For a limited time, yes, you can use the "old" online directory during June and July. The new online directory, fumcsalisbury.breezechms.com will be our only online directory effective August 1. Any updates made to the CTRN Online Directory (old directory) will not transfer to Breeze.

What if I need help uploading a photo? Or other help with the new online directory?

Susan Eldridge will be at church on Mondays June 17 & 24 from 10:00–11:00am to help members with accessing Breeze, uploading pictures, or logging in. You can also call the church office and leave a message with the volunteer for Susan to contact you.

What else can Breeze do?


Breeze ChMS (Church Management Software)

is more than just an online directory. You'll also be able to see the record of your personal giving to the church from this year and moving forward. It has the capability of taking the place of our calendar service, checking people in for events, and scheduling volunteers, and more.
